Message from Rev. D.



HANAMATSURI - Flower Festival

Along our morning path, the seasonal changes call for our attention. For the past couple of weeks, the daffodils have been pushing their way out of the ground. They are usually an early splash of the paint brush of spring. Any day now they will make their announcement with sweet music of color from their trumpets.

Hanamatsuri, the Flower Festival, is our celebration of the birth of the historical Buddha, Shakyamuni. Hanamatsuri is one of our major Buddhist services each year. Each April, we remind our-

selves of the story of the Buddha's birth and reenact the occasion. His birth and life serve as example to all of us to seek and awaken to the deepest truths of life.

The recitation of the Nembutsu opens each of us to the workings of Wisdom and Compassion. Normally, we each are content to stay within our protective shell of self-centered motivation, effort, and gain. But we are also moved naturally to concern for others and to share our lives. The Nembutsu calls us to recognize that the mind of concern and sharing opens to the true realm while the mind of self-centered motivation creates illusion. When the Nembutsu is truly heard in this manner, then we gratefully live in the realm beyond self-centeredness and beyond what we once thought was the normal and only world we have.

As Buddhists and fellow travelers along the Nembutsu path, we commit to this process of awakening. The Wisdom and Compassion received intersects with life experience, and we are allowed to grow, expand, and connect to the infinite realm of Amida.

This year, **Hanamatsuri service** will be **April 10 at 10:00 AM** in Alameda and April 17 at 12:00 Noon at Enmanji. As we did a year ago, the scene of Lumbini Garden will be re-created. You are invited to come to the temple to pour sweet tea over the Baby Buddha. You bring the rain that fell that day in Lumbini Garden 2600 years ago. Please come to celebrate and enjoy the Hanamatsuri Festivities. We will see you at the temple.

Kauai Hongwanji Council Nembutsu Seminar Women in Buddhism - Historiographical Approach Tuesday, April 26, 5:00 pm - 7:00 pm (HST): Zoom Guest Speaker: Rev. Dr. Mutsumi Wondra

Women's roles in the history of Buddhism and Jodoshinshu-Buddhism are vital. In the historiographical approach, this seminar talks about Sakyamuni's stepmother Mahapajapati, Eshinni-sama, and daughter Kakushinni-sama who established the current Hongwanji. In the modernism time, Lady Takeko Kujo, the daughter of the 21st Gomonshu Myoyo Shonin, founded the BWA-Fujinkai in Japan in 1907 and established the first women university, Kyoto Women's University. We also explore the view of women by Shinran, Kakunyo, Zonkaku, and Rennyo Shonins.

OR SUITCASES! Yes, it's time to get rid of those old suitcases, backpacks and duffle bags.



Despite the fact that the Temple has been closed for two years, there have been a lot of things

I would like to bring you up to date on some of the major Temple projects.

We have been diligently working so that Sensei's weekly Dharma message can be viewed live online in addition to being recorded so that they can be viewed at any time. This has been quite a challenge. We have purchased new video and audio equipment, but it is still a work in progress. Of course, the goal is to someday be able to fully open for in person service, just like before. Exercising an abundance of caution, we are being very careful by limiting in person attendance for now.

In celebration of Hanamatsuri on April 10th, we will be setting up an outdoor Hanamido like last year. Members are welcome to come and pour the traditional sweet tea over Baby Buddha and Gassho.
