Spring Ohigan

Writing our newsletter articles, I sometimes feel like the "scout" who would ride ahead of the wagon train to look at what would be expected around the next bend or on the other side of the mountain. I ride ahead to take a peek, and then return to the group with my report. Who knows what might be in store for us around the next bend. Will we find robbers and scoundrels lying in wait, or a beautiful meadow with a freshwater creek flowing nearby? Let's find out.

Each March, we look forward to the Spring Ohigan Service. We can anticipate the milder weather and the balance and harmony of the spring equinox. It is usually a great time of year, as we move past the winter months. The darker and shorter days lighten

up and stretch themselves. Our bodies and minds respond in similar manner. Our Ohigan Service is one of our major services on the Shin Buddhist calendar. Hopefully, we are not only able to recognize the harmony of nature surrounding us, but also to sense this harmony within. We are each the blooming flowers springing up here and there.

The Meditation Sutra encourages us to settle into a meditative mind, sitting while facing the direction of the setting sun to the west. Even as we drive home each evening, we can each conjure images stored in our mind's library of the sun setting, surrounded by reddened clouds. The sun is almost sizzling into the distance as the light of day is extinguished once again. The west is the symbolic direction of the Pure Land of Amida.

Each day we confront our own list of burdens and hurdles that we need to carry a little bit further or to jump over and clear one more time. One after another, we face our personal concerns and goals for the day and check them off as we get them done. With each checkmark, we breathe with a sigh of relief for being one step closer to being done for the day and complete again ... until a new day brings a new list of more burdens and hurdles for us.

The daily list is an extension of our ego self and all our ties. It is not the list of accomplishments that satisfies, but the sense of wholeness and completion that each pause provides. Gradually we open to a world, beyond relative and arbitrary goals and accomplishments, that is whole and complete. The "list of things" carry our clouds of self concern. The clouds drift and hold our focus, but gradually we come to see the sky behind the clouds. We come to a different way of seeing. Perhaps this can be the direction of our Ohigan meditation.
