Message from Rev. D.

Nirvana Day & Eitaikyo

We welcome February and look for signs of the end of the winter season. Signs of the seasons also allow us to recognize the cycles of nature and life rather than the here to there, beginning to end perspective that we often fall into. The cycles of the seasons are more than moving from football to basketball to baseball. We can be reminded of our parents and grandparents who may have worked the land as farmers, gardeners, and nurserymen. Touching the earth and working the soil, they needed to be in harmony with nature much more than we need to at the computer stations of today.

The grounding nature of the Nembutsu path is as valuable as ever as we find our way through cyber isolation, covid restrictions, and the separation from the family base of days past. We seek connection. We seek to identify the self with the greater whole. The Nembutsu provides this connection and identification as we link ourselves to the infinite. It is an awakening to recognize ourselves as a part of the whole and the infinite that we call Amida.

Here at the temple we nurture our spiritual growth as individuals, as families, and as community. We do this by providing our services, our activities, and our events. We encourage participation and membership because we don't connect while standing in isolation. We welcome everyone, both old timers and newbies, to come to our temple and our services. We emphasize our major services as they provide the best way to come to know the traditions of Shin Buddhism and the Nembutsu path.

Nirvana Day is the day the historical Buddha Siddhartha Gautama passed away. Each year we observe his birthday, Hanamatsuri, the day he became enlightened, Bodhi Day, and the day of his death, Nirvana Day. Although he had become enlightened earlier in his life, the Buddha was still attached to this world through the needs and limitations of the human form. At death he was free of the final ties to this world of attachment. He was able to move from the world of attachment to the world of enlightenment ... from Samsara to Nirvana.

This year Nirvana Day will be observed February 12, 10:00 AM. This day will also be our Eitaikyo Service. Eitaikyo is often translated, Perpetual Sutra Memorial Service. The Jodo Shinshu temples and members conduct the Eitaikyo Service for the Dharma to be transmitted from generation to generation. Donations to an Eitaikyo Fund are kept to assure that the temple can continue and provide the Dharma to

future generations. There is also a special Eitaikyo Registry. This is a calendar-type book listing the deceased family members on the day of death. Each day, the morning service is dedicated to the names that appear on the page for that particular day. Thus, by donating to the Eitaikyo Fund, a sutra will be chanted in memory of your loved one in perpetuity. It is with the intent to nurture this vision and wish within each of our members that we hold the Eitaikyo Service each year. Please come to our Nirvana Day/Eitaikyo Service.

Happy New Year, everyone! At the beginning of this New Year, I would like to extend my best regards to you all.

In view of the Russian invasion of Ukraine that began in February 2022, as Nembutsu followers who have deeply inscribed in our hearts and minds Shinran Shonin's message of "May there be peace in the world," we firmly stand against the military infringement of the other nation's sovereignty, and also aspire for immediate return of peace in Ukraine.

Over the last year, COVID-19 continues to be a global pandemic. I would like to offer my deepest condolences to those who fell victim to the disease and express my sympathies to those who are undergoing treatment. I would also like to express my respect and sincere gratitude to the doctors, nurses, and other frontline medical professionals who have been engaging in the treatment of infected people, as well as all essential workers who have made it possible for us to continue with our lives.

The pandemic has forced us to learn firsthand that we will continue to be confronted by unexpected situations even in modern times despite technologies both in science and medical fields being highly developed. Sakyamuni Buddha, who passed on the Dharma to us, made clear that there is no life nor entity in this world that lasts forever. This truth, the principle of impermanence, has never changed even in this time and age approximately 2500 years since his time. Another fact that does not change is our inability to accept this truth as it is, and because of this, we continue struggling.

This is the very reason why, regardless of the pandemic, we can rely on the Jodo Shinshu teaching clarified by Shinran Shonin, which guides us as a spiritual foundation that enables us to move forward even when being overwhelmed with difficulties. A gathering at

the temple with Amida Buddha as its center provides a great opportunity to receive the Dharma as well as an occasion in which people can support and reassure one another as fellow practicers who follow the same teaching.

I hope you will continue to share the teaching within the greater society through various ways and your temple will or continue to serve as a place where people can gather and find comfort in its activities. I humbly ask for your understanding and cooperation in support of your temples. I would like to conclude my new year's greeting with my heartfelt appreciation to you all.
