#### **Spring Ohigan**

Each March, we look forward to the Spring season and our Spring Ohigan (Shunki Higan E) Service. We can anticipate the milder weather and the balance and harmony of the spring equinox. It is usually a great time of year, as we move past the winter months. The darker and shorter days lighten up and stretch themselves. Our bodies and minds respond in similar manner. Our Ohigan Service is one of our major services on the Shin Buddhist calendar.



Hopefully, we are not only able to recognize the harmony of nature surrounding us, but we can also come to sense this harmony within our own lives. We are each the blooming flowers springing up here and there. Like the flowers, we reach out and stretch ourselves to touch the infinite that we call Amida.

Everyday we wake up to a list of things we need to do. Part of my morning ritual is to sit down with a cup of coffee and write down all the things I need or want to get done this day. There may be 10 or even 20 things that need time and attention. One after another, we face our personal concerns and goals for the day and check them off as we get them done. With each checkmark, we breathe with a sigh of relief for being one step closer to being done for the day until finally we can rest and relax. But the next morning brings a new day with a brand new list of more burdens and hurdles and chores to take care of.

The daily list is an extension of our ego self and all our ties to family, work and life responsibilities. It is not the list of accomplishments that satisfies, but the sense of wholeness and completion that each pause provides. There is a moment when we might feel not just good, but whole when one item on the list is done or when everything is checked off at the end of the day. It might be similar to when we recite the Nembutsu or get to the Ekoku at the end of the chant.

Gradually we open to a world, beyond relative and arbitrary goals and accomplishments. We open to a world that is whole and complete. The "list of things" reflect our personal world of self concern. The goals and chores hold our

focus like clouds floating over the horizon, but gradually we come to see the sky behind the clouds. We can see more than our goals and needs and wants. We come to a different way of seeing. Perhaps this can be the direction of our Ohigan meditation and our appreciative call of Namo Amida Butsu.

#### Guest Speaker Rev. Ken Yamada



Rev. Ken Yamada was born in Oakland and attended Berkeley Higashi Honganji temple, participated in Jr. YBA activities and played basketball. After graduating from U.C. Berkeley, majorina in sociology with a Buddhism focus, he studied Jodo Shinshu at the Institute of Buddhist Studies in Berkeley, and Chuo Bukkyo Gakuin in Kyoto, but couldn't understand Buddhism and dropped out. He worked as a newspaper reporter and later became a magazine editor. He rediscovered Buddhism, reentered the ministry and served 13 years at the Berkeley Higashi Honganji Buddhidst Temple

Five years ago, he became editor of Higashi's Shinshu Center of America, overseeing English publications.
