### Message from Rev. D.

**Bodhi Day** - We look forward to our annual Bodhi Day Service as we come to the end of the year. Images of the life of Prince Siddhartha can come to mind from the stories and the pictures we may have shared at the temple through the years. The thoughts of the Prince turned to serious questions no matter how hard his father tried to hide the difficult and sometimes ugly truths of life. The story of the 4 Gates; confronted with Old Age, Sickness, and Death, and then meeting the monk in search of deeper truths in life encouraged the Prince to do the same.



In various ways and at different times, we each trace the same footsteps. We see our own faces and bodies change in the mirror day

by day. Colds and flu and Covid can linger or turn for the worse. Bumps and bruises become breaks and more as our elastic and resilient bodies of younger days become more brittle and susceptible. We gradually lose family members and dear friends as we walk our shared path. Alas, we confront the same conditions and the same truths as the Prince had.
