Message from Rev. D.

GOTAN E 2025

The hillsides are a lush green after all the rain from a few weeks ago. Water is compassion, bringing nutrients and moisture to the grass, flowers and trees.

Gotan E is the Major Service for the month of May, when we are able to recognize the birth of our founder, Shinran Shonin.

One of the often read stories of Shinran is of his 100 Day meditation retreat at Rokkakudo. On the morning of the 95th day, it is said that Shinran had a vision of Prince Shotoku coming to him to urge him to continue on his path to awakening. It is after this vision that Shinran determined to seek Master Honen Shonin. Just as with his prior retreat, Shinran went to Honen each day for another

100 days, rain or shine and regardless of difficulties that came up.

Shinran had questions of the Nembutsu path, and they were answered by Master Honen. He came to recognize that whether you were a good person or not, you would be taken in by the Nembutsu path. It was not our individual efforts to do or be good that would awaken us ... it was the power of the vow of infinite compassion embracing us that awakens each of us. It is a power beyond the self. Shinran's awareness and understanding of the Nembutsu Path became a path of absolute other power and beyond the realm of individual accomplishment. What I did or what I'm capable of was no longer part of the equation for walking the Nembutsu path of awakening. Such a warm embrace of acceptance and welcome was provided to each of us!

Each year, we take this opportunity to reflect upon the life and journey of Shinran Shonin. We remember significant events that mark his path and the development of the Nembutsu teachings. The stories and the teachings have touched each of us. The Nembutsu path may have been a part of our family legacy for generations. Or, it may be a new influence that has come to resonate with our views and our values. As we recognize a personal connection to Shinran, we may feel a sense of validation. Being Shin Buddhist and "a fellow traveler along the way" becomes a part of our identity. Connections validate. **The Gotan E Service** will be on **May 18 at 10:00 AM.**

Also upcoming this month will be cemetery visitations on the **Memorial Day Weekend**. Cemetery services will be held for the Buddhist Temple of Alameda on **Saturday May 24**. Please see the listings of visitation times provided separately. Please mark your calendars to participate. It is always touching to visit the gravesites of our family members. It becomes even more special to do this with temple friends along with family members. We look forward to joining in service together and having the opportunity to meet and visit. I hope to see you there.

The program ran for 31 years, until the pandemic. Today, a small group of 16 meets at Jo's house twice a month. JoJo organizes exercise, music, dancing, singing, tai-chi, outings, games, birthday parties and presentations by guest speakers. She has provided a safe space for seniors to meet and share their past and present highs and lows of life. **Thank you JoJo!**

BCA Offering Special 'Red Carpet Weekend' Orientation Program

The BCA will be offering a unique opportunity for all Sangha members to learn about the Buddhist Churches of America with the new "Members Red Carpet Weekend" in July.

The pilot program, which will be held **July 11-13 at the BCA's Jodo Shinshu Center (JSC) in Berkeley**, Participants in the 'Red Carpet' will learn what BCA is all about and they'll have the chance to experience the best of what the BCA has to offer.

Lodging and meals at the Jodo Shinshu Center will be entirely free. The program is being funded with grants from Dharma Forward, the BCA Executive Committee Bloomquist Educational Endowment and the Bishop's Expansion Fund. Space is limited and registration will open May 1 and close on June 20 or sooner, depending on the number of registrants.

Some of the events already being planned include:

- A roundtable discussion led by Bishop Rev. Marvin Harada and an opportunity for all participants to describe their own journey and path.
- A visit to the Buddhist Church of San Francisco — the first temple in the BCA — and an opportunity to view the temple's stupa housing the holy relics of the Buddha, a gift to the BCA by the Emperor of Siam (Thailand) in 1935.
- Dancing at the Berkeley Buddhist Temple's Obon festival.
- A visit to the BCA Bookstore at the JSC.
- An opportunity for individuals to take part in a Kieshiki ceremony, which involves a person receiving a Buddhist name and affirming their commitment to the Buddhist path.
