## Message from Rev. D.

### Spring Sprung Sprang 2026

**The Spring Ohigan** is a favorite time of year for many of us. Ohigan week marks the end of the winter season and the beginning of spring. The days are getting longer and the sunlight allows us to get more of our outdoor chores done. **Ohigan means "The Other Shore"**. We look to the other shore of enlightenment from this shore of attachments and suffering. We are provided the 6 Paramitas (6 Perfections) to guide us towards the realm of enlightenment. We enact generosity, discipline, patience, energy, meditation, and wisdom to move beyond our usual ego-centered approach to living, towards a life that is marked by compassion, sharing, and gratitude. We move into a life that is attuned to the qualities of awakened awareness and enlightenment.



**Each March, we look forward to the Spring Ohigan Service.** This is one of our major services on the Shin Buddhist calendar. We can anticipate the balance and harmony of the spring equinox. Hopefully, we are not only able to recognize the harmony of nature surrounding us, but also to sense this harmony within. **The equinox is "in here" as well as "out there"**. In a mindful moment, we can sense this connection and settle into it. We see that we are a part of the equinox and not just observing it from a separate point of view.

The Meditation Sutra encourages us to a meditative mind with the 6 Paramitas guiding us. We could be sitting while facing the direction of the setting sun to the west. The west is the symbolic direction of the Pure Land of Amida. When we enter our temple Hondo, we take our seats to face the Onajjin. There, too, the altar is adorned to symbolize the Pure Land. Whether meditating alone, or coming to service at the temple, we look to the Pure Land as our aspiration to move beyond our self-centered and "normal" perspective. **The Nembutsu calls** us away from our thoughts and habits of separation and self to be a part of all else. Perhaps this can be the direction of our Ohigan meditation. **The Spring Ohigan Service is March 22.** We look forward to enjoying this special service together.

**April** will bring us our favorite Hanamatsuri Service to commemorate the birth of Shakyamuni Buddha. **Rev. Yuki Sugahara, Rinban of the Sacramento Betsuin** will be our guest speaker. We look forward to sensei's visit. **Hanamatsuri Service will be April 12 at 10:00 AM.** Please mark your calendars for all our major services!!

By the time the Upaya newsletter is received, Howard, Jane, Kimberly and I will have returned from the **BCA National Council meetings** held at the Hyatt Hotel in Renton, Washington this year. Every year, I try to share with our temple members how impressed I am with the dedication and commitment of all those who come to the National Council. # Transbay Minister Exchange!!!

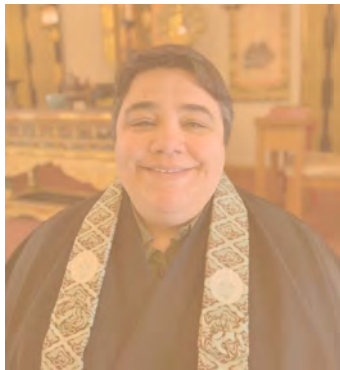
Sunday, March 8, 2026 @ 10AM

**Rev. Melissa Opel** was born and raised in Western Washington State and moved to Eastern Washington to attend college on a partial music scholarship. While in the Spokane area, Rev. Opel earned a BA in Interdisciplinary Studies, focusing on English and Music and later completed an MFA in Creative Writing. After a number of life events that included coming out as part of the LGBTQ community, Rev. Opel left the faith of her upbringing and after a time away from all spiritual practices, began looking into Buddhism. Eventually she made her way to the Spokane Buddhist Temple and never left. In 2019 Rev. Opel received her Tokudo Ordination and then in 2022 her Kyoshi Certification. Rev. Opel is currently the resident minister at the Buddhist Church of San Francisco.

*\*Rinban: Ministers in charge of a Betsuin. There are five (5) Betsuins or central temples within the Buddhist Churches of America (BCA) – Fresno, Los Angeles, Sacramento, San Jose and Seattle – each headed by a Rinban.*

Rev. Sugihara is originally from the Shimane District, north of Hiroshima; he comes from a family of ministers from both his mother's and his father's side in Japan tracing back 15 generations.

He has served at the Florin Buddhist Church, Oregon Buddhist Temple in Portland, Oregon and is currently the Rinban at the Buddhist Church of Sacramento.

## Celebrating Miyako Bellizzi 🎉

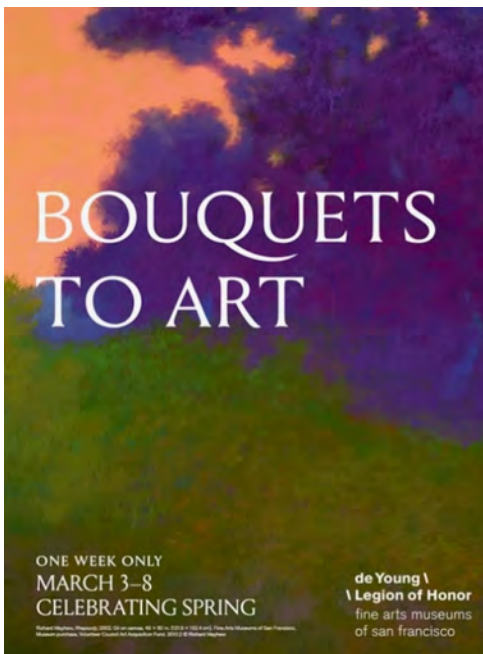
